Subject:MAY 2011 update on recent agricultural commodity and food price
developments in the EU (based on <u>April 2011</u> prices)

Development in agricultural prices

In April 2011, poultry meat price set a new record, exceeding the level achieved in August 2008 by 5% and reaching the highest price in the last 14 years (194 EUR/100 kg carcass weight).

Monthly developments: EU price developments for agricultural commodities showed a mixed picture in April 2011: prices for some cereals and dairy products declined: durum wheat and skimmed milk powder (-4%), barley (-2%), butter and beef (-1%) while for the other products, it increased further: maize (+3%), cheese (+2%), pork (+7%) and poultry (+4%). Soft wheat price remained unchanged. (cf. Table 1).

Year-on-year developments: For all the products, April 2011 prices were above the levels observed one year before: soft wheat (+98%), durum wheat (+69%), maize (+68%), barley (+83%), SMP (+10%), butter (+31%), cheese (Edam) (+19%), beef (+8%), pork (+16%) and poultry meat (+19%) (cf. Table 2, Graphs A2, A3 and A4 in annex).

Development in consumer prices¹

In April 2011, the annual food price inflation increased at the same pace as the overall inflation (+3.2%).

With the exception of "Vegetables" (-0.4%), all the other food categories recorded further price increases in April 2011 as compared to one month before: "Oils and fats" (+0.9%) and "Sugar" (+0.7%) being the categories with the highest increase rates.

When compared to one year ago, the consumer food prices show higher levels, notably for the "Oils and fats" (+7.1%), "Fruits" (+5.8%) and "Sugar" (+5.3%) categories (cf. Tables 3 and 4).





The annual and monthly rates of change of the overall inflation amounted to +3.2% and +0.5%, respectively, whereas the annual rate of change in food price inflation amounted to +3.2% and +0.3% (cf. Graph 1 and Graph A5 in annex).









Concerning food price formation at retail level, it should be kept in mind that the developments of the prices of <u>non-agricultural cost components</u> (labour, capital and energy costs, margins along the downward-supply chain) have a much greater weight on food price inflation than changes in the prices for raw agricultural components.

The graph below shows that every increase or decrease in the agricultural commodity prices generates an increase or decrease in food producer prices and food consumer prices though not fully or asymmetrically (i.e. more pronounced on the increase than on the decrease).










Graph A2 Cereals/bread and cereals based products: EU agricultural market and consumer price developments (Jan2000 until April 2011, Jan2000=100)







